Terry Fisk

"Wisconsin UFOs"

Humans have witnessed UFOs in the skies for thousands of years. Every year, on average, there are approximately 5,000 UFO sightings reported to the National UFO Reporting Center. About 95% of these can be easily explained as natural phenomena, which leaves 250 UFO encounters annually which cannot be explained by science or the known laws of physics. Terry Fisk discusses the top UFO sightings of Wisconsin and the Midwest. Fisk will share photos, case histories, and eyewitness accounts and talk about some of the cases he has personally investigated. He will also address some of the arguments typically offered by UFO skeptics and debunkers.
